March 15, 2020 at our normal time!**

As Senior Warden I speak for your vestry in stating that we understand the concern and uncertainty you may be experiencing surrounding the coronavirus (COVID-19), and we're committed to being responsive to your needs as the situation develops.

We are also committed and believe it important to be "open for business". We want to be available to our members and others who are in need, sorrow or any adversity, to be diligent in prayer, praying for one another, for our church, community, nation, and world. We will hold service tomorrow March 15 at our normal time. We understand that some may feel it prudent to stay home which is perfectly acceptable. Father Rob has said he will make himself available as there is pastoral need.

For those attending the service please help take appropriate precautions as follows:

- Make sure to wash your hands well and frequently.
- Use hand sanitizer
- Wave or elbow bump as we greet each other entering
- Pass the peace with a wave from your seat instead of hugging and wandering.
- Keep a safer distance as we are gathered
- Please use a tissue or sleeve if you have a need to sneeze or cough
- We will use the individual cups again this week for Holy Communion and will follow the distribution immediately with a separate tray to place the used cups in.
- Father Rob will use a good hand sanitizer before the consecration of the sacrament.
- Keep a little extra distance between each other during our coffee hour.
